<u>Subject:</u> One time waiver of Custom Duty as well as inspection requirement in case of debonding of IT/ ITeS units in SEZs and exemption on filing of BOE for goods sold by IT/ITeS SEZ unit which were initially procured on payment of duty and not used for authorised operations.

I am directed to refer to the subject mentioned above and to state that representation has been received in this Department from NASSCOM on the subject mentioned above and the same was examined and with the approval of competent authority following has been decided:

SI No.	NASSCOM recommendation	Remarks
(A)	the custom duty as well as inspection requirement. As part of the current de - bonding process, physical inspection of duty - free goods is done by the authorities to ascertain tax liability depending upon the remaining life of such equipment. Given the fact that majority of employees are working from home using the duty free assets, the requirement of physical inspection of duty - free assets would lead to significant	remaining life of such equipment. The exiting IT/ITES SEZ Unit may opt for simple payment of duty without inspection subject to the condition that they produce all relevant import and other documents of goods to establish their identity and to avoid requirement of physical inspection of duty free goods.
